Update to the Bathing Water Profile based on the report by the European Environment Agency issued in May 2026

Under the provisions of the Bathing Water Directive (BWD), 2006/7/EC, as transposed by Legal Notice 125 of 2008 and amended by Legal Notice 237 of 2011 87 bathing water monitoring points are monitored in the Maltese Islands. The monitoring data and other information regarding bathing water management are reported to the European Environment Agency at the end of the official monitoring season to assess and publish information on the state of the Bathing Water of the Maltese Islands. This bathing water profile is in accordance with, regulation 11, and Schedule III of the legal notice.

Bathing water profile 5 covers 1 monitoring point situated in the locality of Siggiewi as per **Figure 2 and Table 1**. Located along Malta's southwestern coast at the limits of Qrendi and Siggiewi. It comprises two inlets, one of which is dominated by a large cave. The terrestrial area at Ghar Lapsi has boat houses and two jetties.

The monitoring point A17 has been monitored for 23 weeks, by the Environmental Health Directorate. The monitoring period for the official bathing season starts on the third week of May till the third week of October. For the year 2025 the monitoring day where 12th May till 19th October.

The bathing water quality is based on two microbiological parameters (Escherichia coli and Intestinal enterococci). These two parameters determine the classification of the bathing water quality as 'excellent', 'good', 'sufficient' or 'poor'. The symbols shown in **Figure 1** below correspond to this classification. The European Environment Agency report for the year 2025 indicated that 88.5% of the bathing water classified as excellent quality, see **Figure 3**. (European Environmental Agency, 2026).

Figure 2: GIS for the Official Bathing Area of A17

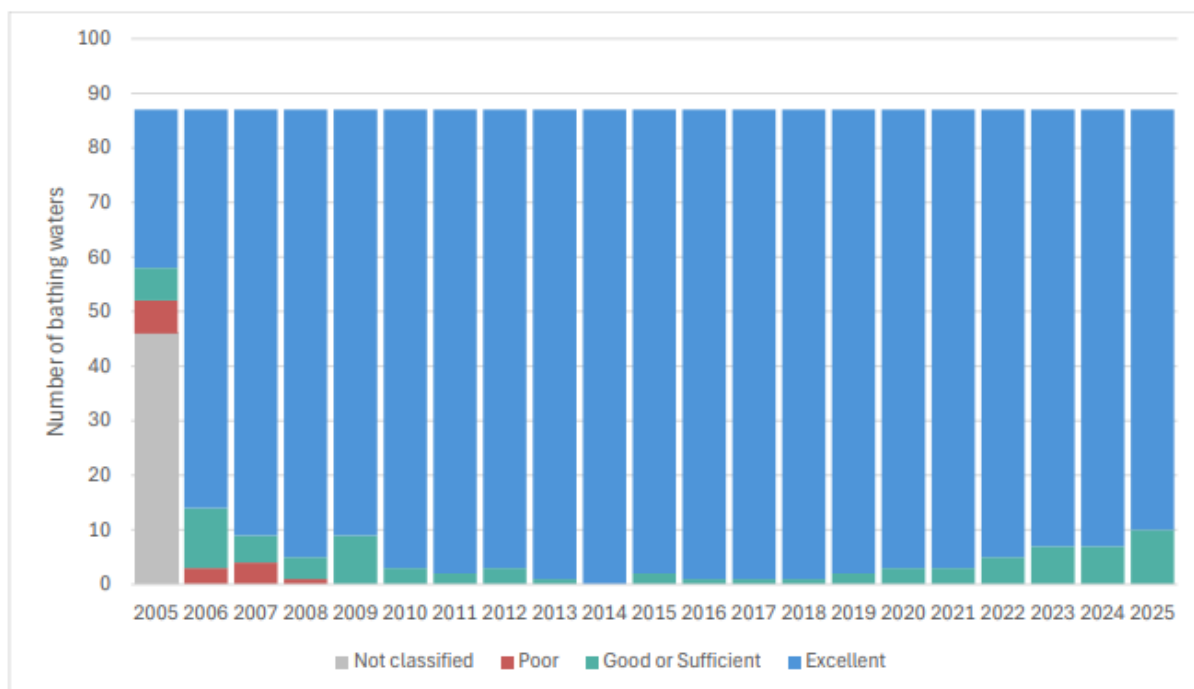

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Identification and assessment of causes of pollution that might affect bathing waters and impair bathers' health;

The risk assessment for monitoring site A17 indicates a low-risk classification. This assessment is based on the identification of potential sources of contamination and their likelihood of occurrence. Factors considered include the presence of rainwater culverts and surface water runoff discharging directly into the bathing area, nearby sewage pumping stations or main sewers, ongoing construction activities, and any recorded short-term pollution events or bathing prohibitions during the previous four bathing seasons.

Based on the data available, the probability of requiring a temporary bathing prohibition or health warning at site A17 is low, as determined from the number of warnings issued over the past four years.

It should also be noted that, following the impact of Storm Harry, the bathing area is not accessible during 2026, which further limited the potential for public exposure during the bathing season.

Temporary closing of bathing water sites during bathing season 2025

No sites covered by this Bathing Water Profile were temporarily closed during the bathing season of 2025.

What should one do if a pollution incident is noticed?

If a risk of bathing water pollution (on-shore or off-shore) is noted, the Environmental Health Directorate is to be immediately notified by calling.

When a complaint is received the Environmental Health Officers (EHOs) will investigate accordingly and if necessary, elevate samples. During the period of any short-term pollution and or bathing prohibition, the EHOs will elevate samples from the bathing site on a daily basis to monitor its quality.

Once the nuisance is resolved and the results of three consecutive bathing water samples conform to the parameters stipulated in the Legal Notice 125 of 2008, indicated that there is no risk to bathers, the warning will be lifted.
